MEDWC organizes an economic and development world conference every two years, in one of the four sub divisions of Manyu. The conferences seek to attract the different stake holders/interested parties in Manyu development to a common forum where pertinent Manyu revitalization issues can be addressed. By revolving the conference venue around the four Manyu sub divisions, MEDWC seeks to spur development and to expose the economic potentials in each sub-division. Manyu division clearly has significant unexploited economic potentials to offer. The next conference is scheduled for December 14-15, 2007 in Eyumojock. MEDWC Mission

Through the various stakeholders, MEDWC seeks to:

- > **Empower the Manyu people** by encouraging and facilitating the creation of small and medium size businesses, and hence jobs in Manyu division.
- > **Promote investments** and business initiatives with potentials for profit to investors.
- > **Alleviate poverty** by promoting sustainable grass root self-reliant development.
- > **Improve the health care** delivery system within the division.
- > **Provide technology assistance** to the local communities, local secondary schools and the local hospitals to increase efficiency.

MEDWC ACCOMPLISHMENTS

The accomplishments of MEDWC clearly reflect the mission of the organization. During the 2005 Tinto Conference, MEDWC accomplished the following:

- > **Organized a health fair** and distributed medications/medical supplies worth over 3 million Frs CFA in Tinto.
- > **Provided financial aid** worth 1.5 million Frs CFA to students of the subdivision.
- > **Donated a new computer** (PC) each to the Tali Health center, the Tinto Rural Council, GHS Tinto, and SAR Tinto.
- Donated 4 new PCs** to the Mamfe district hospital.

> **Donated a generator** to the Tali Health center and a generator to the Tinto Rural council.

> **On April 13th 2006**, MEDWC successfully launched the **Manyu Participatory Development Fund (MAPADEF)** under the patronage of H.E. Hillman A. Egbe. MEDWC raised over 22 million CFA during the launching. The general assembly and the Board of Directors responsible for managing the fund were successfully installed on April 05, 2007.

Goals for Eyumojock 2007

The future of Manyu development resides on our ability to attract the pertinent stakeholders to the economic development round table. These will include the business community seeking for business opportunities and the associated profits, potential investors seeking for returns on their investments, non-profit organizations, healthcare organizations, and if possible the government. **The Eyumojock 2007 conference is thus expected to:**
